# SUCCESS IN FULL MEASURE FOR NPL

Our guest speaker at the Club's February Meeting was delighted to greet a number of Probians as former work colleagues. Fiona Auty, Head of Government Relations at Teddington's National Physical Laboratory proceeded to give a lively talk on the NPL Past, Present and Future. Introduced by Chairman Keith McArthur, Fiona led off with the NPL mission statement "To provide the measurement capability that underpins the UK's prosperity and quality of life." This entails the delivery of the UK Measurement Strategy on behalf of Government as well as commercially won research work. Fiona plays a key role in the securing and handling of major contracts with Government. She went on to point out that as early as the mid-10th century the Saxon King, Edgar kept a 'yardstick' at Winchester as a national standard of measurement. And since its foundation in 1900 at Bushy



House, the NPL has established itself as a world class centre of excellence in measurement science, graced by such scientific luminaries as Alan Turing, Louis Essen and Donald Davies. For over 100 years the NPL has been the silent partner in UK industry in diverse disciplines such as advanced manufacturing, digital innovation, energy and the environment and life sciences and health. Fiona concluded by inviting members to a **special NPL Open Day on Thursday, May 17**th a not-to-be-missed opportunity to view the infrastructure improvements and the cutting-edge, hi-tech laboratories.

After a series of perceptive questions, **Archie McMillan** moved a graceful and well received vote of thanks. (There is no truth in the rumour that shortly afterwards, Archie was spotted measuring the distance to the bus stop).
