IN MEMORIAM - CHRIS OPREY

Sadly, Chris died on Christmas Day. Chris was a much loved and much admired member of our Club. Chris joined us in 1995 and was our Chairman in 2001/2, also chairing the SAC from 2012 to 2019. He was a great holiday and event organiser for the Club.

This is a edited version of his profile which appeared in the April 2002 edition of Pro-Biz.

Chris was born in 1937 in Toxteth. During the war, his father served aboard escort vessels for merchant shipping and Chris can recall sheltering from the blitz with his mother in Liverpool Cathedral! From 1949 Chris attended the Bluecoat School; at one point he was poised to leave and become a plumber but was forbidden to do so by his headmaster. The interdict was vindicated by Chris's success at Liverpool University, where he read History and went on to achieve a Research Masters. This presaged a distinguished career in education as a teacher and lecturer, then in staff management and development. His final post prior tohis retirement was as Principal Lecturer in Education at the West London Institute of Higher Education.

Chris met Pauline at Maria Grey College, and they were married in 1969. They had two children, Abigail and James. The photo here is Chris with his granddaughter Alice. The Opreys lived in Hampton Hill for many years and had a country retreat in Lymington. Chris and Pauline later moved to Teddington. Chris was a volunteer worker at Twickenham CAB, a fount of fact-based information and help.

Chris said "I had never thought of myself as being remotely 'clubbable', let alone a committee man. But from the first, l found Probus delightful, both for its friendly informality and the diversity of members' backgrounds and interests. When I step down from the Chair in April, I look forward to many more happy years as a Probian".

That wish he achieved with great distinction.
