The Admiral Hawke pub in Green Street, Sunbury, was the first time the Club had visited this particular venue. The pub is named after Admiral Edward Hawke, a renowned naval officer who had resided and subsequently died in Sunbury in 1780.

Fourteen walkers met up for the four-mile circular walk and, after recounting the life of Admiral Hawke, set off on what was a very mild, slightly overcast day. The walk journeyed along an enclosed footpath called "School Walk" (why it is called that we don't know as no school was apparent) passing Sunbury Cemetery on the left and London Irish Rugby grounds on the right. We then did a sharp right turn to follow another enclosed footpath over fields eventually reaching Upper Halliford Road.

We then turned left and headed towards the River Thames, continuing with a pleasant stroll along the embankment where Robert Heath drew our attention to the large building which had once been the site for "Wilson's Yard", a former boat building business that had been commissioned during World War 2 to build lifeboats and other craft for the Royal Navy and where Robert's dad had completed his apprenticeship - the property now is a block of flats.

A short detour was made to visit the "Walled Garden" and then a circuit of Sunbury Common before returning to The Admiral Hawke where nine further diners joined us for well earned refreshments.
