WALK & PUB LUNCH: THE LASS OF RICHMOND HILL, RICHMOND, TUESDAY 6th MAY





It wasn't the best of starts at The Lass O'Richmond Hill pub, our venue for the May PROBUS walk and pub lunch, as a large HGV lorry was completely blocking access to the pub's car park. However, after a quick chat and explanation to the driver, entry to the car park was gained and fourteen walkers, along with Mike's collie "Pepper", assembled on what was rather a chilly and overcast day.

A warm welcome was extended to Michael Burrells, who was joining us for the first time, and after a few relative factoids concerning the walk; we headed off into Richmond Park towards Pembroke Lodge Gardens. Our first port of call was King Henry's Mound where, on a clear day, there are fantastic views towards Windsor Castle and other locations to the west and, if you are lucky, a view through the trees of St. Paul's Cathedral, ten miles away to the east. Having spent about ten minutes at King Henry's Mound, we moved on; passing Pembroke Lodge and followed a series of footpaths heading towards Isabella Plantation planted in 1831 by Lord Sidmouth and first opened to the public in 1953. The best time to visit the plantation is without doubt early May, and we were not disappointed as the beauty of the gardens took your breath away. The camellias, azaleas and rhododendrons were in full bloom and stunning. We spent a great deal of time here wandering along blossomed footpaths and streams culminating in the fantastic display of flora around Still Pond.

Owing to the time spent in Isabella Plantation, a shorter route back through the Park to the pub became necessary to fulfill our 12.30 booking where five further diners joined us for a very pleasant gathering along with excellent food and drinks.
